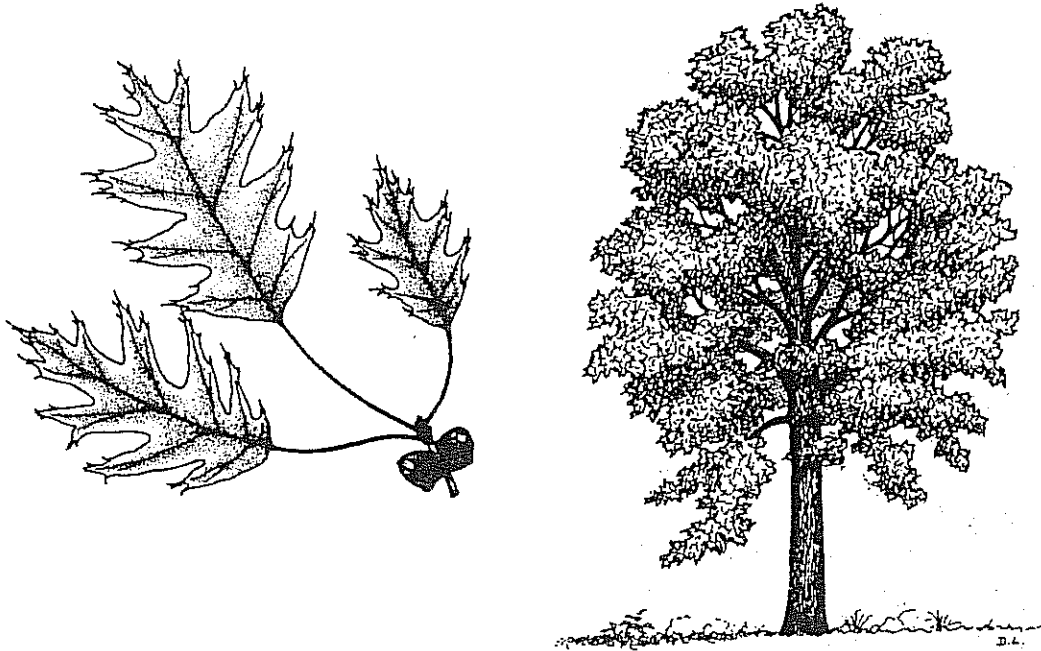

**Terms:** Net due 30 days from date of invoice to established credit line customers, with a 1.8% service charge per month on all past due accounts. When a balance goes beyond 30 days from date of invoice, additional credit extension will cease until other arrangements have been made with us and all purchases will be on a COD basis until overdue balance is paid in full. Cash or check on pick-up for all clients with no established credit line  
We accept VISA and MASTERCARD.

**Credit:** We welcome requests for credit. Credit application forms are available from our office upon request. Please allow 2-3 weeks for credit review.

**Sales Tax:** The State of Minnesota requires that sales tax be paid on all purchases of products purchased in Minnesota unless the buyer provides a complete, valid tax exemption certificate at the time of sale. A tax ID number alone is not sufficient.

**WILL CALLS** All will call orders are pre-pulled. Please give a 24 hour notice prior to desired pick up date. Sufficient time must be allowed to finish loading by the posted closing times on page 1 in this catalog. When picking up your order, bring a tarpaulin or suitable covering to protect your nursery stock.

**PROPER CARE OF NURSERY STOCK**

We suggest a few brief, important, steps to consider when handling your nursery stock.

Do not allow roots to dry out at any time when you are handling your plant material.

Keep out of the sun, wind and freezing temperatures.

If possible, store bare root material in a refrigerated storage area or store plants in a cool, humid room.

Plants may be heeled in sand, sawdust or wood chips for a longer period of time.

If material has been frozen in transit, thaw out material very slowly. It should not be handled until thawed.

**SWEATING BARE ROOT PLANTS**

To provide a warm, humid environment for bud break, lay down the plants to be sweated, in the shade. Cover with a wet packing material, such as a rug, make sure the plants are kept moist. Ideal temperatures should range between 45 and 70 degrees. When the buds begin to swell, the plants are ready to pot or line out. If after a week the buds have not begun to swell, do not become alarmed. In some instances, bud break can take several weeks.

The Minnesota climate presents unique challenges to gardeners, farmers, and nurseries. Temperatures fluctuations rival those of any state in the nation, from hot, sometimes dry summers to extremely cold winters that may leave the land bare of insulating snow. For over a century the University of Minnesota researchers have worked to develop, grow and evaluate the best plants for conditions ranging from USDA Plant Hardiness Zone 4B in south to Zone 2B in certain locations in the north. The University maintains 10 Research and Outreach Centers where breeders and field assistants conduct numerous field trials. Most plant trials are replicated at Grand Rapids, Morris, Rosemount, St Paul, and the Horticultural Center or the Minnesota Landscape Arboretum by Chanhassen. Some plants are also tested nationally, in cooperation with other institutions or private companies.

## WHERE OUR MINNESOTA APPLES CAME FROM

This article was taken from an old book written by an old nurseryman friend, Irv Hanson. The book titled "Just Add Water". Irv Hanson was an old friend Nurseryman from Willmar, MN. He was a school teacher, semi-pro baseball player, a good landscape designer, a good writer, and good friend.

Propagating apple trees is done by budding or root grafting. Only in this way will the progeny be exactly like the parent. Rarely a "sport" will appear. Our Connell Red apple is an all red "sport" that appeared among its less colorful relatives in a "Fireside"

Orchard in Wisconsin. The Connells regard it as a most welcome visitor.

Also, Louis Lautz at LaCrescent found a tree in his Haralson orchard that insisted on coming with solid dark red apples instead of the so-so color normally found in Haralson. The newcomer was named Haralred; it is now being distributed and promises to be a real winner. Both of these red 'Sports' sprouted plenty of long green for their discoverers.

In the post Civil

War days, nursery peddlers from the south roamed the countryside selling southern stock. They grew fine till fall but failed to awaken the following spring. Some folks classed these southern peddlers with lightning rod salesmen, backroom faro dealers and pickpockets.

The early settlers craved fruit, however, and knew better than to stick to a mistake, so they planted their own seeds and the survivors have been the basic stock for our present day apples. It's been a slow, laborious process that's still going on. The University of Minnesota had two plantsmen hunting better fruits on the northern steppes of Russia all this past summer.

Today we have about a dozen sorts being planted in Minnesota. Hundreds of other kinds once grown in the state are no more. A partial list from the Minnesota State Fair exhibit of 1912 follows: Hubbarstan, Non Such, Ben Davis, Lyman Prolific, Martha Florence, Virginia, Tonka, Talman Sweet, Plum Cider, Scott's Winter, Winter Banana, Twenty Ounce Pippin, Pine Stump, Seek No Further, Kansas Keeper and Sweet Russet.

The real impetus to apple growing in Minnesota came from the Minnesota Horticulture Society, founded by about 100 oldsters from around the state. These chaps were all in the November-December of their days. There were no go-getters or after dinner speakers among them; without exception they had worked with their hands – mostly retired farmers, some were still active and had other fish to fry, but they loved their work and always looked forward to the mysteries and surprises of yet another spring among their trees.

This total dedication had something to do with the legislature's establishing a fruit breeding farm at Excelsior. Seedlings were grown there and doled out to members who ran trial stations. The seedlings were numbered, their good and bad habits carefully checked, and the best ones finally named.

These elderly whales of the tree art, held annual meetings in St. Paul that lasted a week. Ideas and experience of the past year were aired in open meetings and they were not always in agreement. Certain members could be counted on to hooch up their faculties, the better to espouse their cause, and arguments did simmer and boil up. By time to disband, all was sweetness and light, all made short speeches giving thanks, and all vowed to carry on the crusade another year.

Minnesota as an apple state will never be a Washington or even a Michigan, but, considering our climatic extremes, the home orchardist's lot is improving and the end is not yet in sight !

I think of Aunt Emma in apple season. She came up with all sorts of delectable apple concoctions, all pure ambrosia, all fit for the gods and all tossed together without benefit of recipes. All cooked on a rattley, old iron stove that burned wood and cobs.

We downed it all nonchalantly, no words of praise forthcoming, as we talked of pigs, cattle and crops. Then we reached for our caps and went back to work. Spoiled ? You bet !

In the early 1900's, the University of Minnesota plant breeders collected wild trees as well as cultivars from New England and other Midwest breeders. Thousands of seedlings were grown from those parent trees, and the record-breaking cold winter of 1917-1918 helped sort out the winners. Some progeny of 'Malinda' – a New England apple – survived and led to the successful apples of the 1920s, including 'Haralson' and 'Beacon'. And some of the 'Malinda' genes live on in varieties released decades later: 'Honeygold' and even 'Honeycrisp'.

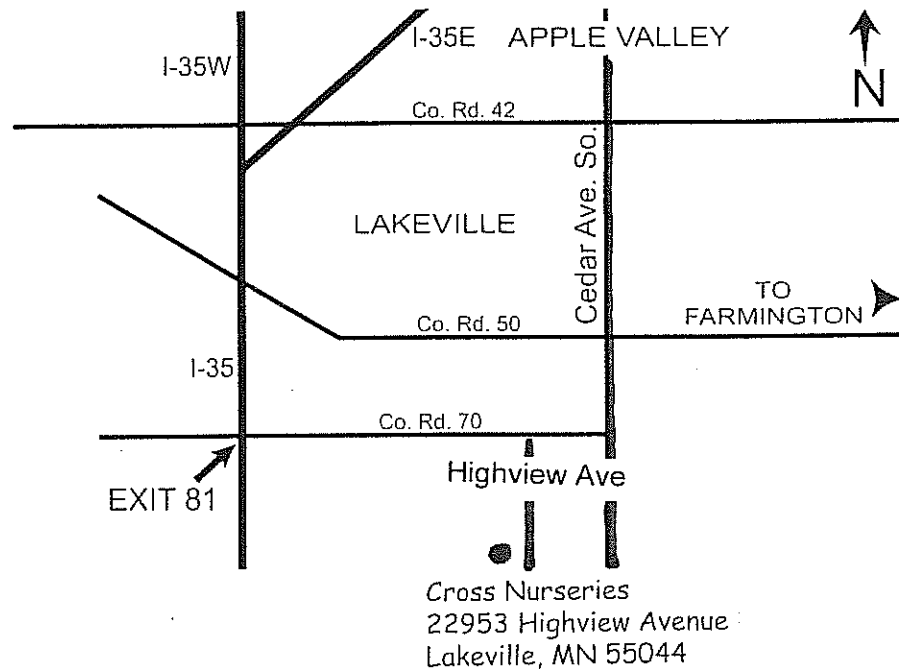
